The Sustainability Office at IE University was established to integrate sustainable practices across all aspects of university life. Its mission is to embed sustainability principles into operations, curriculum, and community activities, while playing a leading role in global sustainability efforts and meeting regulatory standards. The office focuses on lowering emissions and fostering a sustainable mindset throughout the university, inspiring the community to take meaningful, sustainability-driven actions.

THE IE UNIVERSITY 10-YEAR CHALLENGE: A COMMITMENT TO SUSTAINABILITY

In 2020, IE University launched the IE 10-Year Challenge, an ambitious initiative led by the Sustainability Office with the goal of achieving zero net emissions by 2030 and fostering a strong culture of sustainability. Aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), this initiative sets objectives aimed at addressing both environmental and social challenges.

Each year, IE University presents a new sustainability challenge designed to address issues such as carbon emissions reduction, energy efficiency, responsible consumption, waste management, and social equity. Although the challenge shifts annually, each focus remains a long-term priority, ensuring continued relevance. These initiatives engage the entire IE community, empowering students, faculty, and staff to contribute to sustainable progress.

NEW SUSTAINABILITY-RELATED UNITS AT IE UNIVERSITY

ALINNEA

Alinnea is the new Think & Action Tank on Climate Change, hosted by the IE Foundation and supported by the European Climate Foundation. It is designed to fill a crucial gap in the ecosystem of climate change and energy transition entities, working both in Spain and internationally. Alinnea creates a collaborative and inclusive space that bridges diverse sectors, including academia, industry, government, NGOs, trade unions, and other civil society organizations.

Alinnea aims to address the challenges of climate change through multi-stakeholder dialogue, promoting a dynamic exchange of ideas, and developing knowledge-based action strategies. The center provides a roadmap of solutions and recommendations for each barrier to climate action identified through dialogue. Additionally, strategic communication and climate advocacy are key elements of Alinnea's mission.

SUSTAINABLE TRANSITION HUB

IE University has taken a significant step towards addressing the challenges of climate change with the creation of the Sustainable Transition Hub. This new unit reinforces the University's commitment to sustainability, with the aim of providing companies and organizations with essential tools to transform their approach to environmental, social and corporate governance (ESG) issues. The Sustainable Transition Hub stands as a catalyst for integrating sustainability into business strategy, promoting structural change that not only enables compliance with regulations, but also elevates sustainability to a central axis of strategic transformation.

In the year 2024, with the launch of the Sustainability Academy, executive programs in sustainability have been unified, enhancing interdisciplinary learning and research. The Hub has also introduced executive training and strategic consulting services to help businesses develop ESG strategies aligned with SDGs and global regulations. Furthermore, it has expanded international partnerships, collaborating with universities, organizations, and sustainability leaders, and actively contributing to global sustainability forums and conferences.

SUSTAINABILITY STRATEGY

The Sustainability Office was established to promote sustainable practices, ensure compliance with regulatory requirements, and foster sustainability within the IE University community. In terms of governance, the office published its first audited non-financial report. Further, we introduced new procedures to enhance environmental responsibility.



2020

In 2020, we launched the 10-Year Challenge under the UN 2030 Agenda, starting with Responsible Consumption as the first focus. We also updated the Code of Conduct to reinforce our sustainability and social responsibility efforts.

In 2021, we chose Community Building as our challenge of the year and launched the Sustainability Townhall to promote community-based initiatives. We also achieved ISO 14001 certification for Environmental Management. In governance, we introduced the Code for the Prevention of Workplace Harassment.

In 2022, we chose Carbon Footprint as our challenge of the year, completing our first certified carbon emissions audit and becoming one of the first carbon-neutral universities in Europe. We also updated key policies on harassment, discrimination, and equality as part of our governance initiatives.

In 2023, our yearly challenge was Accessibility, Inclusion, and Belonging, focused on enhancing campus inclusivity and fostering belonging. We implemented architectural, educational, and technological solutions for universal access for the entire IE community. Additionally, we launched the KPI Sustainability App to monitor sustainability KPIs from various departments on a yearly basis

2024

2024's challenge focused on Waste Reduction, emphasizing community awareness and process analysis. A key initiative was partnering with the 'Too Good to Go' app to combat food waste on campus. Additionally, the cafeteria collaborated with Bumerang to provide sustainable alternatives to single-use food containers, reinforcing our commitment to reducing waste and promoting sustainability.

SPOTLIGHT

Bachelor in Environmental Sciences for Sustainability



The Bachelor's degree in Environmental Sciences for Sustainability (BESS) is a comprehensive undergraduate program, designed to equip students with a robust foundation in both the natural and applied sciences. This program emphasizes a transdisciplinary approach, blending economic, legal and technological disciplines with a strong focus on developing practical solutions for real-world environmental issues.

The BESS program has reached a significant milestone, with 83% of its students identifying as women. This achievement reflects the program's commitment to fostering diversity and gender inclusion in environmental education.

The program's challenge-based methodology has been instrumental in creating innovative learning experiences for students. This approach enables students to engage with multi-stake-holder partnerships, addressing pressing environmental issues such as water security, heat waves, and ecosystem loss. By working on real-world challenges, students develop critical thinking skills and practical solutions, while actively contributing to global sustainability efforts.

In addition to their academic work, BESS students participated in a variety of extracurricular activities that enriched their educational experience, including:

- Climate Hackathon: An event where students collaborate to develop innovative solutions to climate-related problems.
- Sustainability IE Lab: A platform for students to work on sustainability projects with industry professionals.
- Spring Break Field Trip to Lanzarote: An immersive learning experience focused on the unique environmental and geological features of the island.
- Speaker Series Resilient Earth Dialogues: A forum that brings together experts to discuss resilience and sustainability challenges.

Through these experiences, the BESS program continues to empower students to become leaders in the field of environmental sustainability, equipped with the skills and knowledge to address the most pressing challenges of our time.



SOCIAL IMPACT LAB



The Social Impact Lab functions as an NGO-oriented external consultancy. The work of the Lab involves helping NGOs define their needs and reach their goals and objectives. It operates as a social development consultancy, leveraging the multicultural backgrounds of its participants and the synergies provided by their diverse educational experiences. The Lab's methodology equips students to apply professional criteria to the main causes supported by the NGOs, while fostering a strong sense of social awareness.

LEGAL CLINIC





The IE University Legal Clinic provides students with hands-on experience through pro bono practice. The Clinic offers free legal assistance to NGOs, foundations, and individuals in need, making an invaluable contribution to society. It also supports startups in their early stages, demonstrating the university's commitment to fostering entrepreneurship. Students engage in research, draft legal arguments, and meet with clients, while collaborating with practicing lawyers who supervise their work.

In this Lab, students work in multidisciplinary teams on a program that connects sustainability, climate change, energy efficiency, digitalization, technology, and education to explore new social and business values, with a common focus: food as a tool to connect communities through energy. The project includes meetings with the client during all phases and inspirational talks with key figures in the sector.


D(ESIGN) LAB



The D-Lab at IE University offers Architecture and Design students practical experience through social impact projects that benefit local communities. By bridging theory and practice, the lab encourages students to develop critical thinking, address local and global challenges, and create innovative, sustainable, and socially conscious design solutions. Students work on projects for public schools, city councils, non-profits, and civic associations, gaining hands-on experience in design, development, manufacturing, and assembly. At the same time, the D-Lab helps students build professional networks, accelerating their careers while making a positive impact.

SPOTLIGHT

Slow Fashion Lab



The Slow Fashion Lab (SFL) at IE University fosters sustainability and regeneration in the fashion industry through a hands-on, collaborative educational model. The lab's mission is to create an environment where students engage with real companies, blending academic theory with practical experience. This immersive approach encourages students to embrace sustainable models that prioritize environmental responsibility and social equity.

Over the years, the SFL has partnered with notable companies such as El Corte Inglés, Pyratex, Ecoalf, Ocean Born, and El Ganso, focusing on circularity, second-hand sales, sustainable materials, and cross-institutional initiatives. In the 2023-2024 period, standout projects included a collaboration with AERES, a national platform promoting the social economy, and Hola Vivi, an app that helps consumers make 100% sustainable clothing choices.

In its seven-year history, the SFL has engaged over 150 students from 20 different nationalities, working with more than 14 institutions. These experiences allow students to develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills, helping them understand the complexities of sustainability in the fashion industry. The lab plays a crucial role in preparing students to lead and innovate, transforming them into change-makers—future entrepreneurs, and leaders equipped to drive sustainable business models in a rapidly evolving global landscape.

Throughout their involvement, students gain real-world exposure to business challenges and build confidence as they tackle pressing issues related to sustainability. The lab offers a unique opportunity for them to develop practical skills and insights that extend beyond the classroom, ensuring they are well-prepared for careers in the sustainability-focused business environment. This experience positions students to succeed in an era where sustainability is no longer optional, but essential for business success.



PRE-COLLEGE: GREENING THE FUTURE

Nature-Based Climate Solutions Challenge

Global warming and climate change are among the most critical challenges facing our planet today. High school students have the power to make a difference by developing innovative nature-based solutions to combat this crisis.

In this challenge, students are tasked with creating a comprehensive plan for a nature-based climate solution that can be implemented locally or globally. The solution should not only address the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions but also contribute to the overall health and sustainability of the environment.

UNDERGRADUATE: IE Impact Challenge

The IE Impact Challenge is a multidisciplinary, academic program for all IEU students whose mission is to develop leaders of positive change. IE Impact aims to enlighten IE students about some of the most complex challenges. Through the IE Impact Challenge, the students are empowered to help real-world enterprises, whose missions are driven by sustainability and the SDGs.

MASTERS: MIM Challenge + Splash Projects

The MIM program has engaged students in sustainability-focused projects through Splash Projects, which provide hands-on, community-driven experiences. Across all intakes, students work on impactful intiatives. For the January 2024 intake, students constructed playground swings, a recreational area, and seating for an underprivileged school.

These projects foster a sense of joy and fulfillment, as both students and staff experience the rewards of giving back. Under the guidance of experienced supervisors, students work diligently for hours, sometimes under challenging conditions, demonstrating humility and teamwork beyond the classroom setting.

The Good Goal App Challenge

The Good Goal and IE joined forces to launch a Challenge aimed at reducing CO2 emissions and improving habits. This initiative supports the environmental cause and aligns with SDGs 4, 11, 12, 13, and 17. It encourages students to take responsibility for their actions and become agents of change. Through this collaboration, IE becomes one of the pioneering universities to implement such a tool in the educational environment

The objective is to enhance the academic program by adding a practical and behavioral component. This approach aims to build a committed mindset towards the environment and the well-being of students, while also fostering a "competitive" environment for positive impact.

SUSTAINABILITY IMPACT RESEARCH AWARDS

The IE University Sustainability Office, in partnership with the IE University Research Office, launched an annual awards program to recognize and celebrate our faculty's efforts in advancing sustainability for people and the planet. The awards are granted to academic and applied research fostering sustainable impact in the following two categories:

1. SUSTAINABLE IMPACT ACADEMIC PAPERS:

Two €5,000 awards were granted to academic papers that have already been accepted by a journal in the IE High-Interest Journals Lists, or applied research projects that have already gone through the first filter of the EU funding selection process.

2. SUSTAINABLE IMPACT RESEARCH PROJECTS:

Five €2,000 awards were granted to research projects in the process of being submitted to a journal in the IE High-Interest Journals Lists, or applied research projects that are in the final phases of development.

CENTER FOR SOCIAL INNOVATION & SUSTAINABILITY

The IE Center for Social Innovation and Sustainability is dedicated to advancing social innovation and sustainability by fostering research, collaboration, and the exchange of knowledge. It promotes initiatives that address global challenges, working closely with international partners and the IE community to develop impactful projects. The center facilitates collaboration on projects that promote sustainable development, conscientious leadership, and the use of technology in social innovation. By leveraging a global network and applied experience, the center works to generate new knowledge and spread best practices that drive meaningful societal change.

CENTER FOR TRANSPORT ECONOMICS & INFRASTRUCTURE MANAGEMENT

The IE Center for Transport Economics & Infrastructure Management focuses on advancing knowledge and research in the areas of transport, mobility, logistics, and infrastructure management. Supported by the IE Foundation and leading global companies, the center conducts seminars, publishes reports, and activities that generate valuable insights. It aims to become a reference for policy makers, professionals, and companies by providing independent analysis, policy recommendations, and applied research. The center also seeks to shape opinions on key issues affecting the future of transport and mobility, both nationally and internationally, and contributes to the training of future managers through its research and studies.

CENTER FOR HEALTH & WELL-BEING

The IE Center for Health & Well-being is focused on helping individuals thrive in today's fast-paced world by enhancing human performance, development, and well-being. The center equips students, staff, alumni, and the broader community with essential skills to live and work effectively, drawing from medical science, health science, and positive psychology. It aims to support people in managing stress, improving their overall performance, and fostering well-being, aligning with IE's core values of creating a community committed to making a positive impact to flourish over the long-term.

IE CENTER FOR DIVERSITY IN GLOBAL MANAGEMENT

The IE Center for Diversity in Global Management helps organizations navigate complex challenges by leveraging diversity to foster resilience, efficiency, and innovation. It serves as a valuable resource for the IE community, focusing on training, applied research, and awareness-raising activities. The center promotes international debate through networking events and draws on IE's strengths in technology, entrepreneurship, and the Humanities. Supported by the IE Foundation, it is dedicated to advancing the understanding and application of diversity in global management, helping organizations adapt to a rapidly changing world.

SPOTLIGHT

Center for Sustainable Cities



The Center for Sustainable Cities promotes sustainable urban development through innovtive solutions and strategic guidance. Collaborating with governments, corporations, and communities, the center focuses on creating resilient, equitable cities with tailored decarbonization and operational strategies. Key areas include urban regulations, informal settlements, and logistics networks to enhance sustainability and community well-being. The center also engages in knowledge dissemination, professional development, and community collaboration through workshops, training programs, and research symposia, supporting organizations in addressing sustainability, social justice, and climate change challenges

One key initiative was the seminar "Strategies and Technologies for an Urban Future" in collab-

oration with Madrid City Hall. This event examined the relationship between urban strategies and technological innovation, featuring discussions on sustainable practices, enhancing urban livability, and fostering collaboration among academia, private industry, and public institutions

Additionally, in the past three years, CSC has completed nine private-sector research projects and aims to expand into public sector collaborations. It is working to secure partnerships with key entities like the Madrid Regional Administration and EIT Urban Mobility and is developing a method to translate applied research into academic contributions.

CHAIRS AND OBSERVATORIES

The IE Foundation aims to promote the transfer of insights through its chairs and observatories. These initiatives foster learning and innovation across a wide range of areas, ensuring ongoing advancement in knowledge development.

IMPACT BRIDGE - IE CHAIR FOR SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND IMPACT INVESTING

The Chair seeks to use the potential of quality academic research to contribute to the transformation of social and environmental problems while maintaining a renewed vision of the business and financial world.

IE-ELECNOR OBSERVATORY ON SUSTAINABLE COMPLIANCE CULTURES

An initiative with Elecnor Foundation, in collaboration with the law firm Eversheds Sutherland, and the full involvement of IE Law School. The objective is to promote ethical commitment within organizations, especially in small and medium-sized companies where there is limited knowledge of regulatory compliance and requirements.

OBSERVATORY FOR DEMOGRAPHICS AND GENERATIONAL DIVERSITY

The Observatory of Demography and Generational Diversity aims to address key demographic issues and their socio-economic impacts. It is dedicated to developing innovative management models that tackle the challenges and opportunities of leveraging senior talent in the business world.

JOSÉ MARÍA CERVELLÓ CHAIR

The José María Cervelló Chair provides scholarships to students with an excellent academic record who wish to pursue a legal program at IE Law School. Additionally, the Chair aims to foster debate and disseminate legal knowledge, support research projects, and promote dialogue on current legal issues among professionals in the sector

JOIN4IMPACT OBSERVATORY

Join4Impact explores how new technologies can create positive social impact. It focuses on proactive impact management and multidisciplinary research. The observatory shares knowledge through an annual applied research report.







United Nations System Staff College (UNSS)

IE School of Politics, Economics & Global Affairs has an overarching agreement with the United Nations Systems Staff College that bolsters the Bachelor in International Relations to shape the global leaders of tomorrow. The curricular design, the extracurricular programs and the teaching led by the UNSSC equip students with the right knowledge, hard and soft skills, and attitudes needed to make a difference on a global level and make sustainable and impactful changes in society.

CIVICA

IE University has joined CIVICA, an alliance of eight leading European higher education institutions in the social sciences. As the newest members of CIVICA, IE University and SGH join Bocconi University (Italy), Central European University (Austria), European University Institute (intergovernmental), Hertie School (Germany), National University of Political Studies and Public Administration (Romania), Sciences Po (France), Stockholm School of Economics (Sweden) and The London School of Economics and Political Sciences (United Kingdom). CIVICA has worked to establish a truly European, inter-university campus. In doing so, it has piloted the EU flagship initiative to enhance strategic partnerships in European higher education and research. CIVICA members have drawn on their joint expertise and shared European values to offer students and staff innovative, transnational opportunities in education, research and civic engagement, with special emphasis on digital innovation and an overarching mission to serve European societies.



IEUMUN Junior

The IE University Model United Nations Organization hosts IEUMUN Junior, a high school-focused Model United Nations Conference. Since its inception in 2020, IEUMUN has united students from diverse cultural and national backgrounds, providing a platform for constructive dialogue and collaboration. In line with its commitment to social impact, IEUMUN operates as a fully charitable conference, donating its annual profits to charitable organizations.



Raia Summer Research Program

The youth-led international think tank welcomes IE University students into a joint Summer Research Program to analyze different climate leaders using the RAIA methodology. The primary objective of this initiative is to delve into the role these leaders play in climate policy, pinpoint the turning points that led them to their climate leadership positions, explore the solutions they advocate and evaluate the impact they've had in the real world.



Refugee Camp Simulation – Humanitarian Crisis Management

In this immersive and hands-on simulation, in collaboration with the organization Cooperativa Humanitaria, students played the role of humanitarian NGO team members responding to the needs of refugee/displaced population.



BS4CL (Business Schools For Climate Leadership)

The Business Schools for Climate Leadership (BS4CL) partnership brings together prestigious institutions, including IE, LBS, Cambridge, Oxford, INSEAD, HEC, IMD, and IESE. This collaboration is dedicated to amplifying the impact of business education in the fight against climate change. Key initiatives include the establishment of an engaged community of alumni champions to inspire action, and the hosting of the BS4CL Forum, which will tackle the critical issue of financing the climate transition.



Seventh Fundación Mapfre Awards For Social Innovation

The Fundación MAPFRE Awards for Social Innovation, with an individual endowment of €40,000, seek to support projects that improve people's lives—namely in the areas of health and prevention; safe, healthy, and sustainable mobility; and active aging and the aging economy. The finalists will join Red Innova.



Damm Foundation

IE University, the IE Foundation, and the Damm Foundation have partnered to work together driving social impact through education. Both parties have signed a 10-year agreement that consolidates their mission to promote diversity at IE University. With the support of the Damm Foundation, the IE Foundation







will manage scholarship programs for young people with extraordinary profiles from around the world to access IE University programs, as part of the institution's mission to build a prosperous and equitable society.

Financiers Without Borders

Since 2011, IE Foundation supports entrepreneurship and financial inclusion in Ghana through Financiers Without Borders. IE faculty, students, and staff have technical assistance, capacity building, and facilitated access to new sources of financing to Ghanaian FNGOs with the capacity to help the lowest-income entrepreneurs to build their path out of poverty.

Council of Business and Society (CoBS) 2024

The Council of Business and Society (CoBS) brings together a diverse group of institutions, including IE, ESSEC, FGV, Fudan, Keio Business School, Monash University, Washington University in St. Louis, Smith School of Business, Stellenbosch Business School, Trinity College Dublin, and Warwick Business School. This coalition focuses on promoting responsible business practices through initiatives like the CoBS Advanced International Certificate and the Student CSR Article Competition. In 2024, CoBS also participated in the Academy of Management Conference in Chicago and hosted workshops at ESSEC, fostering valuable knowledge sharing.

Repurposing Management Education 2024

The Repurposing Management Education partnership includes IE, Polimi, Tum, EDHEC, UCL, and University College Dublin. This initiative seeks to adapt management education to address current challenges in environmental and social justice. Activities include a Reps workshop at UCL in September 2023 and the "Foresight 2050" conference in June 2024, focusing on the future of business education and its role in promoting sustainability and justice.

Innova Europe

Innova Europe features a collaborative network of institutions, including EDHEC, ESMT Berlin, POLIMI, University College Dublin, Kozminski University, Kyiv School of Economics, Erasmus Business School, ETH Zurich, IE, and Aalto University. This initiative encourages entrepreneurial ideas that support the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). A key highlight is a competition inviting students and alumni to pitch innovative early-stage and MVP ideas, culminating in a final event at EDHEC in Paris to showcase impactful contributions to sustainability.



SUSTAINABILITY TOWNHALL

It is essential that staff and students participate in initiatives that positively impact the campus, the community and beyond. Being a part of a community unites us, building cohesion and resilience which allows us to adapt to whatever the future may hold. To that end, the Sustainability Office has created the Sustainability Townhall to evaluate, on a regular basis, proposals for initiatives that the Townhall could help pursue and fund. This year, these initiatives included sponsoring students from local institutes to participate in the IE Model United Nations (IE MUN), and installing sustainable 3D filament machines for design students.

Sustainability Townhall Highligh

The ReBottle initiative integrates technology, design, and recycling to tackle plastic waste on the IE Segovia campus. By collecting used water bottles and repurposing them into 3D printer filaments, the project creates a sustainable solution that reduces plastic waste. Using a Polyformer—a machine that transforms PET plastic into 3D filaments—ReBottle establishes a circular life cycle for plastic bottles at IE. This benefits architecture and design students by making valuable materials available while also minimizing waste on campus.



SPOTLIGHT

Women in Business Club



The Woman in Business Club is a community of students at IE that are interested in empowering women to achieve success in the business world. They bridge the gap between motivated women and corporate opportunities, connecting students with industry leaders, hosting skill-building workshops, and facilitating direct recruitment events.

Through their initiatives, including panel discussions, professional workshops, and industry-specific dinners, the club aims to provide women with the knowledge and networks they need to advance in male-dominated fields. By collaborating with top female talent, the Women in Business Club creates the platform that not only raises awareness but also drives actionable change towards gender equality.

ProfeSHEonal Certification Program

Launched in 2023, the success of the ProfeSHEonal Certification Program has led to its return in 2024. This 4-episode series is designed to equip female students and young professionals with the tools and knowledge they need to confidently embark on their careers.

The series addresses crucial aspects of professional development, offering practical insights, expert advice, and interactive discussions to prepare participants for success. It culminates in a special closing ceremony where participants can celebrate their growth, connect with industry leaders, and receive their certification.

7 AFFORDABLE & CLEAN ENERGY



Renewable Energy: Paths and Perspectives in Europe

The IE Energy Club hosted "Renewable Energy Paths and Perspectives," featuring Julio Ramón Castro González, CEO of Iberdrola Renewables, moderated by José María Calvo-Sotelo, a professor at IE Business School. Key topics included the EU's Clean Energy Quest, sustainable energy solutions, the climate crisis, and green job opportunities. Following the discussion, a networking session with the CEO and IE alumni provided attendees with the chance to connect over food and drinks while discussing the future of renewable energy.

IE Energy Day

The inaugural IE Energy Day gathered energy enthusiasts to explore the sector's future. Highlights included a masterclass on digitalization by Félix Campos from BCG, company presentations from leading firms, and a panel discussion on innovations and trends featuring experts from Avalon Renovables, Nexwell Power, EDP, and CEPSA. Attendees networked with industry leaders and recruiters while enjoying food and drinks. The event was organized by the IE Energy Club in collaboration with IE Talent & Careers.

Climathon 2023

A two-day hackathon and competition focused on addressing the inequitable access to clean and renewable energy technologies and practices. The event fostered collaboration and innovation, with a goal to bridge gaps between stakeholders and ensure fair access to clean energy for all.

The 2nd Digital Revolution: Powering the Energy Transition

The event focused on how digital revolution is reshaping the energy sector. Speakers shared insights on innovative technologies that boost efficiency and drive sustainability, highlighting the vital connection between digital advancements and a greener future.

B DECENT WORK & ECONOMIC GROWTH



Can Social Entrepreneurs Help Achieve the UN Sustainable Development Goals?

This session explored how social entrepreneurs develop innovative solutions for the world's most underprivileged people, playing a crucial role in achieving several United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including poverty and hunger eradication, universal access to education, and clean water and sanitation.

Beyond GDP and Growth: Alternative Measures of Development, Economic Progress and Wellbeing

The event explored how, for decades, GDP growth was celebrated as the holy grail for economists, the private sector, and policymakers, driven by the belief that stable economic growth would ensure prosperity and development. Yet, it also raised critical questions about GDP's adequacy as an indicator of progress, urging a reevaluation of what true success means in today's world.

Unbreakable Conference: The Art of Breaking Barriers

The conference featured a sequence of two panels focused on the vital topic of gender equality. Each panel showcased speakers who shared their experiences in breaking barriers across various career paths, specifically in "Sustainability, Law & Regulations, and Technology & Innovation" for the first panel, followed by "Leadership, International Relations, and Finance" for the second.

Strategies for Sustainable Global Transformation: Intersecting Economies, Impact Investment and Policy

The gathering featured experts championing a sustainable future. Belén Viloria, Executive Director at B-Lab Spain, shared insights on fostering a fairer and more inclusive economy. Raúl Sánchez, Director of Impact Investments at COFIDES, discussed the transformative power of impact investing. Meanwhile, Fernando Valladares, Scientist and Research Professor at The Spanish National Research Council, highlighted biodiversity's critical role in combating climate change and preserving ecosystems.

Climate Change and Economic Growth: A Dilemma of Our Time

The session hosted by the IE School of Politics, Economics & Global Affairs and the IE Mexico Club featured an insightful conversation with former President Felipe Calderón (2006-2012). Attendees engaged in a discussion about the multifaceted challenges and innovative solutions at the intersection of environmental sustainability and economic prosperity, all within the context of SPEGA's Planet Series.

Ink for Impact: SDG Book Reading Night

The discussion focused on Factory Girls by Leslie Chang, which examines the life changes of five women who leave rural China for urban factory work, highlighting their struggles in harsh conditions. Chang underscores that economic growth and decent work in a technological revolution depend on English proficiency and access to technology. The book also addresses how mass migration can lead to informal employment, resulting in a lack of social protection for many workers.

Econ Talks with Otaviano Canuto: BRICS, China, Latin America

The discussion explored the dynamic interplay between these regions in the global economy. Participants delved into topics such as the rising significance of BRICS, China's influence on Latin America, and initiatives aimed at poverty reduction.

Challenges & Opportunities for Latin America & the Caribbean: The Role of the IDB Group

The event titled featured Ilan Goldfajn, President of the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB). As a Brazilian economist and former governor of the Central Bank of Brazil, Goldfajn shared insights on the challenges and opportunities facing the region.

Sustainability Transformation - Family Business in China

The event highlighted the uniqueness of Chinese family firms through the IE-Banca March report, "Is there a 'family premium' in the Chinese stock market?" Presented by Cristina Cruz, Chair of the IE Center for Families in Business, the session explored family involvement in Chinese businesses. Attendees also heard from Beyond Green, a sustainable Chinese family firm, about its commitment to sustainable practices.

Foresight 2050: Environmental and Social Justice in Business Management

The event was organized by IE in collaboration with other European institutions, including POLIMI, EDHEC, TUM, and UCL.



Tech for Humanity: Pioneering Innovative Solutions in Emergency and Humanitarian Crisis Response

This masterclass explored case studies highlighting the transformative impact of technologies in real-world humanitarian crisis situations, creating a discussion around the challenges, opportunities, and ethical considerations they present.

IE Africa Business Forum: Innovating Africa's Creative Industry Landscape

The event brought together industry leaders, entrepreneurs, and innovators to discuss trends, challenges, and opportunities shaping the sector. Participants engaged in thought-provoking panels and workshops, sharing insights on how to harness creativity and technology to drive growth.

Al4Democracy Day

Sustainability Datathon 2023

Launched by the IE School of Science and Technology, the IE Sustainability Datathon brings together 90 students from different bachelor's, master's and dual degree programs. The 2023 edition challenged students to work in teams to develop machine learning models to forecast filtered water demand and consumption for an area selected by Acciona Agua. Over the course of three weeks, students used the company's data to create their solutions and pitch them to a panel of judges made up of partners and sponsors.
